Domaine Samuel Billaud Chablis Grand Cru "Les Clos" 2015 Burgundy, France

<u>93+ Points</u>

(just a single one-year-old Chassin 200-liter barrel produced; Billaud's vines are high on the hillside, near Blanchots and next to Faiveley's holding, in a zone where there's a lot of fan leaf virus; in fact, Faiveley has decided to hold back their tiny quantity of 2015 Clos for a future anniversary celebration): Bright yellow. Rather cool scents of ginger, cinnamon, white pepper and crushed rock. The palate displays a juicy, tight core of lemony citricity, with terrific energy and penetrating acidity. Very fresh, tight grand cru with nothing exotic about it; less fat and more salty than the Valmur. Finishes brisk and palate-staining. A baby today and built for extended aging. (ST)
